





Pre-Reader



The Season after Pentecost is the season of growing! We're growing in our faith. Plants are growing in farms and gardens!


How many plants are in each row? Circle the right number.





WORKING IN THE VINEYARD


Plant seeds  in rows.



Draw grapes  on the stems.






Draw the plants  growing.




Put the harvested grapes  in this basket.
